

Our students at Crandall Middle School have been blessed to have the opportunity to have the Still Waters program presented for the past three school years. The leaders use age appropriate information given to the girls and boys on many of the issues our students face in their daily lives.

Our girls are encouraged and built-up each session letting the girls know they are valuable, beautiful young ladies who can do and become whatever they strive to achieve. They are also given information on timely issues such as bullying, family issues, friendships, sexual promiscuity throughout the school year using high morals for the basis their presentations.

Boys are given information on subjects such as bullying, internet acceptable use and laws, self-concepts, and other pertinent issues faced by our students each day. They are also encouraged to act with dignity and respect as they grow to become responsible young men with good character.

I have had the ladies come speak to my Health and PE classes on Human Development and Making Good Choices. They spent the entire day with my classes giving information, answering questions in with loving attitudes that made the students feel comfortable to seek their counsel. I have had students ask to stay and speak with the leaders after the program to be counseled on personal issues. The leaders are always happy to give of their time to meet with these students.

I especially am impressed how they use role play to get the students involved in the discussion. Other lessons include activities where the students get in groups to write positive words about the other girls in the group. The girls took away a ring of cards with kind, loving thoughts. I still see these rings hanging on the girls' book bags or purses.

I am so proud our school district sees the importance of allowing Still Waters to come into our schools to present our students with a program that teaches respect, high moral character, tolerance and striving to achieve happiness within. The leaders of Still Waters continually work to present information that is educational, entertaining, and most of all empowering for our students to become strong moral young people to make choices in an educated and well thought out manner. Only then will our students be able to achieve their dreams and become responsible members of our community.

STUDENT CASE SCENARIOS

The following stories are real. These are teenagers who contacted us after hearing us speak at their school. Our desire is to give you a glimpse of the help that is being offered to many students like yours. These programs are making a difference and we are privileged to be able to serve local communities in this way.

ENABLING HEALING



"A" is a student who approached us after hearing our presentation, **You Are A Gem**. For the first time, she was able to speak out that she had been sexually abused by her biological father when she was younger. "A" went through our sexual abuse recovery class called Walk On Water (WOW) to receive healing from her past abuse. "A" now serves as a teen support to others who attend WOW.


REAL KIDS. REAL LIFE. REAL HELP.

"B" is a student who heard us speak at her school when she was in middle school. She had contacted us a few years later because she thought she was pregnant. We were able to provide a free pregnancy test and educate her on all of her options in truth and love. Her test was positive and she chose to carry her baby to term. Several weeks passed, and "B" had two medical scares with her pregnancy. She was extremely grateful for the support she received from Still Waters. "B" stated several times that she 'had nowhere to go and we offered her help'."

DEVELOPING TRUSTING RELATIONSHIPS



"C" is a student who spoke to us privately one day when we were speaking at her school. She confessed to us that she had previously been raped. Long story short, this precious young lady had been sextrafficked. The abuse was reported and we worked closely with the proper authorities. We developed a trusting relationship with this young girl in hopes for her to receive healing not only from the sexual abuse she encountered but also from a past miscarriage.



Gem On A Journey is our teaching series for 6th grade girls.

This program series focuses on how life issues (home life, things that happen to us, school situations, etc.) affect us in different ways. It explains how our words and actions affect others. It addresses speaking out and acknowledging our hurts, bullying (hurting people hurt other people), building others up and not tearing them down, reaching out through leading, living a life of purity, and seeking appropriate help through trustworthy adults.

Gem On A Journey equips girls with tools to help them navigate through their life journey.

Listed below are the sessions included in this program:

- Session 1 You Are A Gem
 You are special. There is no one like you.
- Session 2 *The Sleepover* Change the way you think. Everyone is fighting a battle.
- Session 3 Speak Life You reap what you sow. Your words matter.
- Session 4 Waiting On Your Prince
 Your kiss is a special gift. Don't give it away freely.

• Session 3 - Protector


In order for you to protect those you care about, you must first protect your own mind, heart, ears and eyes.

GIVE UP is our teaching series for 7th grade boys.

This program series challenges boys to "Give Up" common attitudes and fears; to have an extreme attitude against "the norm". When guys are willing to stand up against what the world says is "normal" or "okay", lives are impacted and changed... forever!

These students will be given challenges and encouraged to step it up; to be the leaders they were created to be. They will be encouraged to "Give Up" common attitudes and make an impactful change in their world.

Give Up reveals the truth that real life situations can shape the way they view themselves and others. Students will realize the decisions they make today really do matter.

Listed below are the sessions included in this program:

• Session 1 - Bucking The Norm

Give Up common attitudes and fears associated with life's pressures and choices.

• Session 2 - Fear Is A Liar

You don't have to believe everything you think.

- Session 3 Life Stories You are not defined by your past. (Speaker shares his personal story.)
- Session 4 Walking Tall Respect girls and their hearts... and YOURS. (Discuss sexting & setting boundaries.)





STAND UP is our teaching series for 8th grade boys.

This program series challenges boys to "Stand Up" against the things that many of their peers are already doing. They will learn not only the emotional and physical consequences that stem from making unhealthy decisions, but also the legal consequences.

Stand Up empowers students for High School where peer pressure will be even greater than what they are currently encountering. During this school year, we will educate and equip students in order to help them make healthy choices when faced with the common pressures of a teen boy: pornography, sexting, premarital sex, and sexually transmitted diseases.

Listed below are the sessions included in this program:

• Session 1 - The New Drug

You will learn how your brain works when Pornography is viewed and how easily addictive it is.

• Session 2 - Sexting

Not only will you learn about the legal consequences of sexting, but you will also realize how life-altering one decision you make can change your life, the girl's life and countless others around you... in an instant!

• Session 3 - The Love Test


What is real love? Are love and sex the same? You will learn about the risks of pre-marital sex and how they can change your life; now and in the future.
